This **excellent amount** was raised through the **CAFOD Pyramid box** collections and the **CAFOD Box in St. Mary's.** Thank you to everybody who supports these collections in a small or bigger way. It proves once again that 'every penny counts' in support of CAFOD's work for poor and marginalised people all over the world!

PARISH ADVISORY COUNCIL ELECTIONS – COMING SOON

The Parish Advisory Council (PAC) consists of 12 elected members and 5 ex-officio members. It is a **consultative body** and advises Canon Joe on **Parish matters** and on decisions he has to make. The Council meets about 6 times a year.

Elected members serve for 3 years, after which time, they are eligible to serve a second term of 3 years and can apply for re-election. After serving two 3-year terms, they have to step down for at least one year.

This year, **two elected members** have completed two terms and **have to step down.** They are Christiane Cantlay and Joyce Harding. We are grateful to them for their dedication and generosity of spirit. They have to be replaced. **Any parishioner can be nominated** to serve on the PAC.

Nomination forms are available **until Sunday 10th February** from the sacristy in both churches.

CYCLE OF PRAYER

The need for such mutuality has not gone away. As individual parishes struggle, we need more and more the prayer and support of each other. So the Commission again offers a cycle of prayer for Parishes of the Diocese. We shall be including the names of particular parishes, their clergy and other institutions in that parish week by week.

Each parish community is part of the Diocesan "Family" and it is a reminder to us that we are part of a bigger wheel, and we are all in communion with +George, our Archbishop, one in mind and heart, in the service of Jesus Christ.
