"We consider the defence of our native land, our historical memory and our hope; our God-given right to exist; to be the sacred duty of the citizens of Ukraine. The defence of our Fatherland is our natural right and civic duty. Now has come the time to unite our efforts in order to defend the independence, territorial integrity and sovereignty of the Ukrainian state.

We are convinced that the world cannot develop and find answers for the challenges of today by resorting to might and violence; by showing disdain for shared human values and the truth of the Gospel. I call upon all people of good will not to ignore the suffering of the Ukrainian people, brought on by Russian military aggression. We are a people who love peace, and precisely for that reason we are ready to defend it and fight for it.

We call for the gracious blessing of a loving God and Creator, upon the Ukraine and its people".

SYNOD OF BISHOPS 2023 - UPDATE.

I write to thank you all, parish representatives, parish teams, parishioners, priests and deacons, for all the time and effort you have put into carrying out the synodal process in your parishes and in writing your Report and sending it in. We received 41 Synodal Reports and one from the University Chaplaincy. They were all most interesting to read, the characteristics of your different parishes, the methods you used, and the views of your parishioners, under the headings of Communion, Participation and Mission. It was a challenge to you all to start the "listening and discernment" process, to gather views in a variety of ways and to write a report, all in a reduced time frame.

Members of the Diocesan Synodal Team each took one of the themes and read that section across all 42 reports. They wrote one or two pages about the emerging themes in their section. These constituted Draft One and these pages were then considered by the Team this week. One member has now written what is in effect, Draft Two. All members of the Team are reading that Draft and will produce their comments so that Draft Three, the final Draft, will be produced this weekend. This will then be sent to the Archbishop. It will be sent out to parishes on the weekend of April 9th/10th. The Report will appear in the May edition of the Catholic People and will also be put on the archdiocesan website.

I believe that all of you who have been involved in any way, great or small, can be rightly proud of your contribution. You have responded to Pope Francis' call to walk together and to enter into a "synodal" process of listening and discernment, walking humbly with God, being led by the Holy Spirit and recognising Christ in each other and listening to each other.

The submission of the Reports and the Diocesan Report are not the end of the road. It is hoped and expected that the synodal way of doing things will continue, that we will embark on an ongoing journey of synodal conversion and that we will work towards fulfilling Pope Francis' dream of a wholly synodal Church. You have begun at parish level and I wish you well as you continue to do things in a synodal way.

SAINT OF THE WEEK St. John Baptist de la Salle (April 7th)

Our present day school system is mainly in the hands of the state. Schools under religious direction are in the minority. Yet in earlier centuries the Church alone ran schools, and pathfinding educational reforms were achieved by churchmen. An early advocate for modern education was St. John Baptist de la Salle, in France around 1700.

In the France of Louis XIV, there were schools enough for the sons and daughters of the upper classes. However, children and youth from the common folk had no access to these schools.

John Baptist de la Salle (1651-1719) cam e from a rich noble family and was well educated. As a newly ordained priest he was aware of the lack of schools for the common people and made it his life's work to promote schooling for these lower social classes.

He established the "Society of Brothers of Christian Schools" which, continuing in our day, has accomplished immeasurable good for Christian education. [Mgr. Joe]

REMINDERS

FACE COVERINGS - PROCEED WITH CAUTION.

Face coverings are no longer mandatory in indoor public places in Wales, except in health and care settings. This means that people have the choice to wear a mask or not in the church if they so wish. Having said that, with the Covid infection rates sky high at the moment, it is recommended that face coverings remain for the time being.

However, there will be some people, who may not be comfortable with being too close to a person not wearing a face cover. If this is the case then there are "Leave-a-Space" cards available that you can place on the pew next to you. Just ask a steward.
