

# Evangelisation.

Good things have happened in recent weeks. The 'Light is On For You' which encouraged some Catholics back to confession, as the churches in Cardiff opened on Wednesday nights before Easter, including St Joseph's, Penarth. The Youth 2000 retreat attracted more than 100 young people to attend in St. David's Catholic College. The Divine Mercy Group responsible for the service in St.Alban's Splott last Sunday attracted some Catholics back to the practice of the faith who had been resting for many years. A number of people still attend the Tuesday drop-in .lunchtime talks at the Cornerstone, opposite St. David's Cathedral, thereby enhancing their knowledge of the faith. All in all it has been a very encouraging and joyous time of evangelisation, which has borne much fruit.
