### MESSAGE FROM ARCHBISHOP GEORGE.

The following message was issued on Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> July 2021. "I have been informed by the by the Apostolic Nuncio that the Holy Father has accepted my resignation from the pastoral governance of the Archdiocese of Cardiff, having reached the canonical age for retirement. Pope Francis has added the formula "Nunc pro Tunc " in his decision. The simple translation of these words is "now for then". In other words, a decision has been made which will be implemented sometime in the future. In practice this means I shall continue my service as bishop of the diocese until the Holy Father appoints a successor. There is no fixed term or date for this canonical arrangement. I am sure you will join with me in prayer to the Holy Spirit as Pope Francis makes provision for the diocese in naming the 8<sup>th</sup> Archbishop of Cardiff".

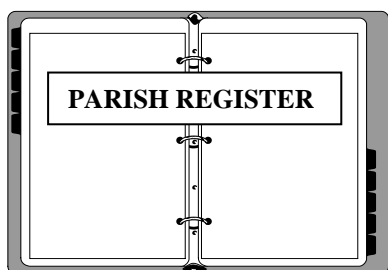

### CAFOD'S COVID APPEAL MOVES ON.

A big thank you for the substantial donation received from an anonymous donor recently. Their generosity boosted the amount raised by a significant amount and enabled the appeal to reach its current target which was £5,000. Nobody needs reminding that Covid-19 stopped our normal way of life in Lent 2020. Churches were closed and social distancing meant lower numbers were allowed in each church when they re-opened. There were only 48 Public Masses at St Joseph's and 12 in St Mary's during the financial year. This has had a serious impact on income.

Many parishioners already had monthly bank standing orders set up and active Gift Aid declarations. More signed up using the links to documents on the Parish web site, and the Archdiocese has set up links on its website so people can make online payments to each Parish. During the lockdown periods offertory contributions arrived through the Presbytery letter box in the form of Gift Aid envelopes, anonymous cash and a number of cheques.

As can be seen in the accounts, income for the year is down about 40%. To balance this, church running costs were about 25% lower than a normal year. This means that there was small loss of £200.

On 23<sup>rd</sup> December 2020, the River Cadoxton in Dinas Powys overflowed following exceptionally heavy rain, flooding more than 100 dwellings and businesses. St Mary's Church was flooded to a depth of about three inches. The church was fully insured, and re-opened for Mass at the end of June. The extensive remedial work has cost over £50,000.

Third party donations could also be made online. Donations in church were: Cafod (£580), Easter Offering (£900), Cafod Harvest Fast (£1,108), SVP (£1,178), Christmas Offering (£2,003)
