### ST. MARY'S OPENS FOR SUNDAY MASS.

Today St. Mary's church in Dinas Powys will re-open for public Mass at 11.15am. Mgr. Joe is very much looking forward to celebrating Mass there once more, after a six month period of closure due to the Coronavirus.

### A DIFFERENT EXPERIENCE OF MASS.

We have seen an alarming increase in people testing positive for the virus over the last week or so, and indeed the predicted second spike is happening. Most of Wales is in lockdown again and personal liberties are restricted once more. We have to comply with current government regulations of course and because of them, the number of persons allowed in St. Mary's church for Mass is limited to **40 persons**. There are other restrictions too, with no music, no singing allowed, and no gathering outside after Mass. The Stewards will be on hand to guide and direct the congregation so that everyone stays safe and well.

### ST. JOSEPH'S NEW SUNDAY MASS TIME.

Because the 11.15am Mass on Sunday morning will return to St. Mary's today, the **9.30am** Mass in St. Joseph's will be re-introduced. This will be a Mass with a congregation and current regulations of social distancing restrict the size of the congregation to **50 persons**. All Masses from St. Joseph's however, will continue to be streamed. Visit the website and check out the "Mass Times" from the main menu.

### THE ROSARY DURING OCTOBER.

Despite lockdowns and social distancing measures and other restrictions, we shall be reciting the Rosary and Litany of Our Lady before weekday Masses in St. Joseph's during October. It will begin half an hour before the streamed morning Masses on Mondays (ie 9.00am) and at 6.30pm on Fridays, during Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament before the 7.00pm public Mass.

On Wednesdays at 9.00am, because he will be alone, Mgr. Joe will recite the Rosary by himself and you are invited to join him on stream and to recite your Rosary with him.

### FACE MASKS MUST BE WORN IN CHURCH.
