### TOILETRIES DROP – THIS WEEKEND

The fourth of our Toiletries Drops this year takes place **THIS weekend 3<sup>rd</sup> / 4<sup>th</sup> November**. Thank you so much for your regular contributions of toiletries for Sister Ruth O'Neill and **Space4u**. Your generous donations enable them to provide their clients (destitute asylum seekers) with weekly access to these basic necessities. They are always grateful for any donations, but the essential items (for men) are soap, shower gel, shampoo, deodorant, toothbrushes, toothpaste, razors, toilet rolls and washing powder tablets.

**NOVEMBER DEAD LISTS – Month of the Holy Souls.** During November, daily Masses are said for the Holy Souls. In particular for those named in the November Dead Lists which are placed on the altar. **Special envelopes are available at the back of both churches for your lists.** You do not have to enclose money in your envelope, but if you choose to do so, it will be donated to **Aid to the Church in Need (ACN)**. This organisation is a **Pontifical Foundation** which helps **persecuted Christians** all over the world. They are in **Iraq**, helping Christians return to their homeland; they are in **Syria and Lebanon, Egypt, Nigeria, Pakistan and parts of Sudan, India and the Philippines. China, North Korea and Eritrea** are also on the radar of ACN. In a recent report, ACN stated that, between 2015 and 2017, the **situation for Christians had declined** in those countries **as a result of violence and oppression**. The one exception was **Saudi Arabia** where the situation was already so bad, it could **scarcely get any worse**. A few copies of the ACN booklet **Persecuted but never forgotten** are left at the back of both churches. Please take one.

The Sacrament of Confirmation will be conferred by **Archbishop George Stack** in **St. Mary's, Dinas Powys** on the **17<sup>th</sup> May 2019 at 7pm**.

**PARISH HALLS – HEALTH AND SAFETY – FOODS** – Would groups using **both halls please be aware** of the **Food Allergy Notice** adjacent to the serving hatch and the **warning** it carries. It reads ***Please be advised that food available on these premises may contain allergens.*** It then goes on to give examples e.g. milk, eggs, wheat, soybean, peanuts, tree nuts, fish and shellfish. There are also **two** 'stand up notices' in the kitchens which **must** be brought out and placed at **each end of the table(s)** where food is laid out **whenever** there is a "food" event.

**PARISH HALLS – ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH – INSTRUCTIONS FOR KITCHEN USE** – A new notice has been displayed on the **wall of the kitchen** in both halls. Would groups using the halls **please familiarise themselves with it**. It concerns the cleanliness of kitchen surfaces and covers, the correct procedures regarding the **presentation of food at all times**. It also covers the personal hygiene of those involved in food preparation. The hall should be cleaned after **every event** and left in the same standard of cleanliness in which it was found. Thank you.

## SECOND WORLD DAY OF THE POOR IS COMING –

**18<sup>th</sup> NOVEMBER** – Last year, **Pope Francis** announced that the 33<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of each year would be **World Day of the Poor** in the Catholic Church. He invited Catholics across the world to meet those in poverty IN ENCOUNTER: In Penarth and Dinas Powys, the Day is an opportunity to **PRAY** and reflect on the ways we support the poor – Home Access, Home4u, Reaching the Unreached (India), SVP and the many and varied appeals we respond to during the year. In the words of Pope Francis “The poor evangelise us and help us, each day, to discover the beauty of the Gospel”.

**CATENIAN BURSARY FUND** – The Catenian Bursary Fund is a UK registered charity, with the aim of offering **financial help to young people** about to volunteer to do something wonderful for others. Over **£1 million** has been distributed in this way, through the two grants available – an **Individual Project Award** and **The Lourdes Award**. All Catholic **young people aged 16 to 21 are eligible to apply** for help – recent grants have been for trips to Lourdes, Uganda, Thailand, Vietnam and Africa.
