HOME ACCESS FORTHCOMING COLLECTION

The charity, at Tabernacle Baptist Church, Penarth, helps clients to secure suitable accommodation; it provides bonds to landlords for this purpose. The properties are inspected prior to clients moving in. They also assist clients to obtain housing benefits and check that entitlements are secured. Funding is needed to maintain this voluntary service so **your contributions are much appreciated**.
