Prayer Walk – Church of St. Theodore of Tarsus

The priest and people of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church of St. Theodore of Tarsus (formerly St. Cuthbert's) will undertake a sponsored Prayer Walk on **Saturday 3rd October**, starting at 9am from the entrance to the Ely Trail outside of Fitzalan High School.

The purpose of the walk is to offer prayers for the city and people of Cardiff, while raising awareness of their existence as a Church community and funds for their ministry.

They will begin with prayers together at the start of the Trail and then proceed in the direction of Cardiff Bay. At the Bay, they will stop to serve the corresponding Hour (Divine Office) and to take refreshments, then continue on the Taff Trail, making our way to Tongwynlais, where they will conclude with the last corresponding Hour between 3 and 4pm.

Anyone may join with them at any time along the route, and may walk as long or as short a time as they feel able. Most importantly, the route is being covered in its entirety by Fr James Siemens and their pastoral assistant, Mr Joshua Brown.

Sponsors are invited to inform them of any special petitions they may have that they would like remembered on the day. Additionally, they will themselves be prayed for by name at the Divine Liturgy the following day (Sunday 4th October). "We ask for the prayers of our holy patron, St. Theodore of Tarsus and of the Most Holy Theotokos (Mother of God) as we undertake this endeavour on behalf of the parish and of the whole community".
