THE RETURN OF PUBLIC MASSES.

This is the third weekend that we have been able to celebrate Mass publicly with a congregation. Parishioners have told me how nice it is to be actually present at Mass again, and back in the familiar surroundings of the church. None of the public Masses have been full to the limit as yet (50), and people should not be discouraged from coming along if they so wish. However, we recognize that there are still some who prefer to stay away for now, because as we know, the virus is still out there. It is worth reminding ourselves that **the Sunday Obligation** is still lifted and will remain so while the pandemic continues. The Masses will continue to be streamed from St. Joseph's for the duration of the pandemic and beyond,

THE NEXT STEP.

Mgr. Joe says it is his intention to move the 11.15am Mass on Sunday morning back to St. Mary's and to re-introduce a 9.30am Mass in St. Joseph's. He is hoping that this can be achieved by the end of the month or early October. However, the role of the stewards is crucial in this and without them it just isn't going to be possible. **We need at least another 2 or 3 volunteers from St. Joseph's – perhaps from those who usually attended the 9.30am Mass. REDUCED CAPACITY OF CHURCH & HALLS.

Churches and Halls are treated as separate buildings for Health and Safety purposes. Because of social distancing requirements, the maximum number of people in the congregation has to be calculated. In St. Joseph's it is 50 persons and in St. Mary's it will be 37. **For the halls** a similar calculation has to be made. St. Joseph's hall has a maximum capacity of 18 persons and St. Mary's hall has a capacity of 14 persons. This places severe restrictions on their use and the number of people that will be allowed in them at any one time. **Both Halls are therefore CLOSED and cannot be used until further notice. No one should have need or reason to gain access to either of them.**

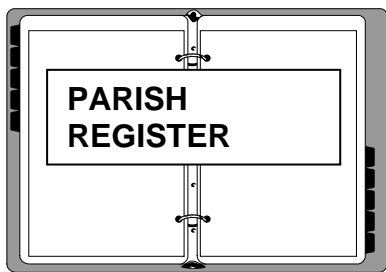
WILLIAM JONES RIP.
