We have a Pastoral Letter from Archbishop George which will be read out at all Masses today (2nd Sunday of Advent). The main focus of the Holy Year will be the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and Catholics are invited to respond to this "Time of Grace" and experience once again the mercy and forgiveness of God for which they crave. God's mercy will always be greater than any sin, and no one can place limits on the love of God, who is ever ready to forgive.
