**GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY TODAY (4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter) A day of Prayer for Vocations to the Priesthood and Consecrated Life. There will be a SECOND COLLECTION TODAY for the PTF (Priests' Training Fund)** Every baptised Christian has the vocation of making Jesus present in the varying circumstances of life. Today, however, we affirm **the importance of the ordained priesthood at the heart of the sacramental life of the Church.** The call to priesthood is as real today as it has ever been, although it may be more difficult to hear in a world opaque to the things of God. This is one reason why our homes, schools, parishes, colleges and chaplaincies need to be 'schools of prayer', in which young people in particular learn how to listen to God's word and draw more closely to Him on a daily basis. **Pick up a prayer card from the back of church.**

The **Archdiocese of Cardiff** is currently blessed with **six men preparing to serve as priests** in the years to come. They need your prayerful support, not least when they come to parishes on pastoral placements. They also need your financial support in order to fund their training and formation so there will be a **second collection THIS WEEKEND. It takes over £20,000 to train a student per year (over six years). ### WELSH NATIONAL SHRINE – CARDIGAN

A beautiful **statue of Our Lady** was said to have appeared on the banks of the river Teifi and it became a **place of pilgrimage**. In the 20<sup>th</sup> Century. Monks from Brittany gave their Abbey the name of **Our Lady of Cardigan** and revived the devotion. They left in 1916. In 1952 a new statue was commissioned and was placed in a **new shrine** which was dedicated as the National Shrine of Wales by Pope John Paul II in 1986. During Pope Benedict's visit in 2010, the statue was blessed at Westminster Cathedral. Visitors from near and far have come to pray at the statue. This year the Welsh National **Pilgrimage** to Cardigan led by Archbishop George Stack will take place on **21<sup>st</sup> May**. We hope that some members of our parish will be able to attend. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is an important element of the Pilgrimage and all are welcome to attend. **SEE POSTER.**

## CENTENARY OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA

Pope Francis will visit Fatima on 15<sup>th</sup> May. In England and Wales a **statue of Our Lady of Fatima** with its new Golden Crown will **visit churches and cathedrals** throughout the United Kingdom. Cardinal Nichols crowned the statue on 18<sup>th</sup> February in Westminster Cathedral. This visitation will come to **Cardiff THIS WEEKEND**. On **Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> May** there will be a **Choral Mass at 11am** followed by an hour of devotion. The statue will leave the Cathedral at 2.30pm to rest **until the Monday 8<sup>th</sup>** at the University Chaplaincy at Nazareth House.
