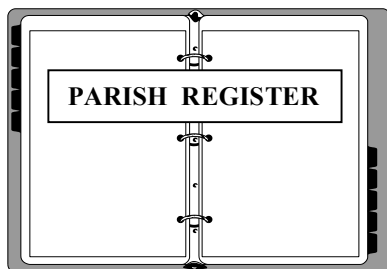
THE “TRINITY” - AN UNFATHOMABLE MYSTERY.

To describe the “Trinity” in words is not too difficult. We have only to absorb the words of Jesus himself when he reveals that the Godhead is a “Trinity” of persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Three Persons in One God. Easy to say; not so easy to explain. And although St. Patrick managed to explain it visually to great effect, over in Ireland, using the shamrock, nevertheless it is difficult for us to “understand” the Trinity, because the mechanics of it have never been explained.

It is a bit like trying to explain the World Wide Web. Unless you have specialised knowledge in that field, it is probably beyond capability of the average human being to understand how, by keying in a few characters on an electronic device, we can communicate with countless numbers of people all over the world, instantaneously. It may be difficult to explain, but it is really quite simple to do, once we have learnt what keys to press.

The fact is the explanation isn't the important thing. The most important thing about the www is the reality of it; its availability to us; the communications it makes possible, and the connections it creates between people.

The Trinity is a bit like that; difficult to explain, but easy to know about. And the important thing is not the explanation, but rather its reality; the communication with God it makes possible for us; and the connections it creates between the Father, the Son, the Holy Spirit – and OURSELVES. The Trinity is a “family” of persons, and we are part of that family by virtue of our Baptism. WOW! The mystery of the Trinity, so complex and yet so simple. (Monsignor Joe).
