THE CREED OF MARRIAGE

Our Catholic faith and the teaching of the Church enable us to affirm the truth about marriage and family.

WHAT WE BELIEVE: -

We believe that marriage is a sacred and beautiful vocation, because: –

We believe in God our Father, who creates every person, male and female, in His image and likeness; **We believe** in Jesus Christ, God's Son, our Saviour, who reveals what it is to be fully human, who show's God's love to us and commands that we love one another:

We believe in the Holy Spirit, whose living presence sanctifies our hearts and purifies our desires;

We believe in God as Three Persons, a relationship of reciprocal mutuality and equality, the model for all human relationships.

There are two readings from the Book of Genesis which are heard frequently at weddings (Gen.1:26-28.31 or Gen. 2:18-24). Both of them tell the story of Adam and Eve, a love story between a man and a woman, set in the idyllic setting of the Garden of Eden, where they enjoy God's love and his providence.

The Genesis story explains how God created the world in which we live – he endowed it with life – and

He created man and woman for each other. Thus the Institution of Marriage as we understand it was established by God and written by Him into the Laws of Nature. (Canon Joe).
