Mission Appeal Next Week. The Columban Fathers.

The Columbans are missionaries who go in the name of the Church to announce, by deed and word, the good news of Jesus Christ and with the following specific objectives: -

- to establish the Church where the Gospel has not been preached;
- to help local Churches grow into evangelizing communities open to all peoples;
- to promote dialogue between Christians and those of other religious traditions;
- to facilitate interchange between local Churches, especially those from which we come and those to which we are sent;
- to help people become fully human, to help establish a world of peace with justice and care for the integrity of creation in solidarity with the poor.

The Columbans strive to identify with Jesus of Nazareth who said: "He has sent me to bring good news to the poor, to proclaim liberty to captives, and to bring new sight, to set the downtrodden free and to proclaim the Lord's year of favour" (Luke 4:18)

November Dead Lists:

During November, Masses are said for specific intentions (where applicable) and also for the Holy Souls - in particular those named in the November Dead Lists, which are placed on the altar. **Special envelopes are available at the back of both churches, in which you may insert the list of names for commemoration of your departed family and friends.** Any donations received will go to an Emergency Medical Appeal for Syrian Babies and Children, run by the Dominican and Comboni Sisters at two hospitals in Jordan.

The International Refugee Trust (IRT) tells us:

"Impoverished and sick Syrian refugees are crying out for healthcare. The Dominican Sisters and the Comboni Sisters run two well-respected hospitals in Jordan, one in the capital Amman, and the other in the town of Karak, farther south. Every day Syrians arrive at the hospital desperate for help. Many have illnesses which are exacerbated by the terrible living conditions which they have to endure. Many are incredibly poor and cannot afford to pay for medical care. The Sisters do all they can for them, but they need to be able to do more. Sometimes just a few antibiotics will solve the problem, but some quite complicated operations are also needed. Any help is greatly appreciated".
