It was with great sadness that we learned of the death of Fr. Michael in the early hours of Monday (All Souls Day). He had been ill for some time but there was a rapid deterioration in his health over the last couple of weeks. Fr Mike was parish priest in St. Mary's, Dinas Powys during the 1990's and latterly served the parish of St. Gabriel's Ringlands, Newport, until his retirement in 2018. He was living in retirement in Maesteg. Our thoughts are with the family at this time. Funeral arrangements will be announced in due course but they will be subject to current Government restrictions.

LOCKDOWN LIFTED IN WALES. [Mgr. Joe]

With the current Lockdown in Wales coming to an end on Monday 9th November, Places of Worship can resume their Services from where they were before the Lockdown came into effect. This means that (in the case of our parish) public Masses with a congregation will recommence from Friday 13th November at 7pm, after exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. Then the weekend Masses will follow as normal: 5pm Mass on Saturday evening, and 9.30am Mass on Sunday morning in St. Joseph's (all streamed live) and the 11.15am in St. Mary's, Dinas Powys, which is not streamed. On weekdays the Masses at 9.30am in St. Joseph's on Monday and Wednesday will continue to be streamed live without a congregation. We must bear in mind, however, that

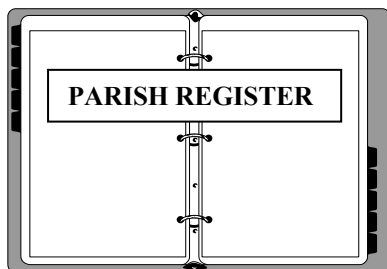
the situation is unpredictable and the pandemic is spiralling out of control in some places and Lockdown measures may have to be re-introduced from time to time.

NO OFFERTORY COLLECTION IN LOCKDOWN.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION – ADVENT.

Mgr Joe will be re-introducing the Sacrament of Reconciliation in St. Joseph's **during Advent**. A special section of the Lady Chapel will be set aside for this purpose and there will be a steward on hand to ensure that social distancing is observed. Confessions will take place on the four Saturdays of Advent beginning on **28th November** from 10am to 11am. This will be for a trial period.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS.

On **Friday 20th November**, during the 7pm public Mass in St. Joseph's, Jeremy Aguinaldo and Ruth Leggett will receive the Sacraments of Christian Initiation and so be received into full communion with the Catholic Church. This should have taken place at the Easter Vigil earlier this year but was postponed due to Covid-19. Jeremy will be receiving adult baptism as he has not been baptized. Ruth was baptized into the Anglican Communion so baptism is not necessary for her. Both of them will then receive the Sacraments of Confirmation and the Eucharist, to complete their Christian initiation. Please pray for them both as they near the end of their journey to Rome.

NOVEMBER DEAD LISTS.

During November, daily Masses are being offered especially for the deceased loved ones of parishioners. If you are taking part in the streamed Masses, you will see that a symbolic number of **empty** November envelopes have been placed in the box on the altar in both our churches. **They represent the envelopes and lists that you brought in last year. So if you brought in an envelope last year, with your list of deceased loved ones, then one of the empty ones this year is for you and yours. There is no further action required.**
