Education Sunday – This Weekend.

Parish Advisory Council (PAC) 2014 Election next

There are 4 members of the PAC who have completed their first term of office after 3 years. The 4 members are: Anne Chilcott, Joshua Flynn, James Payyampalil, and Benny Augustian. We are grateful to them for giving their time and expertise to the PAC over the last 3 years.

Nominations will close this weekend (Sunday 16th Feb is the last day for handing in nomination papers). The first of the elections will be held next weekend 22nd/23rd Feb 2014. So

far five nominations have been received and there are 4 places to be contested.

How does the election work?

When there are two Church communities involved (as we have), the PAC Constitution allows for this. In order to ensure that there is at least one elected member from each community, a separate election takes place in each church BEFORE the main election. Consequently we have election (1) next weekend 22nd/23rd Feb 2014 and election (2) on the weekend of 1st/2nd March 2014.

Who are the candidates from each community?

The nominees (so far) are (St Joseph's) Theresa Keating, Paul Gallone and Benny Augustian. The nominees for St Mary's are: Trixie Douglas and James Payyampalil.

ELECTION (1) 22nd/23rd Feb 2014 (next weekend)

Ballot papers will be inserted in the Gazette. Only parishioners who normally attend St Joseph's can vote for the St Joseph's candidate and only those who normally attend St Mary's can vote for the St Mary's candidate. When the votes are counted, the successful nominee in each church is then elected to the PAC. The unsuccessful nominees go forward to the main election (2) the following week ie 1st/2nd March 2014.

Who will supervise the elections and count the votes?

Tim white (St. Joseph's) and Val Kacal (St. Mary's) will oversee the election process and declare the results.
