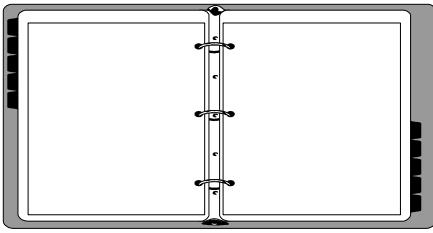

#### The Celebration of the Sacred Triduum in Holy Week

The three days of the Triduum, beginning with the evening Mass on Holy Thursday and concluding with the Easter Vigil Mass on Holy Saturday, should form a liturgical unity. Although in the past the Triduum has been divided up between the two parish communities for the sake of expediency, it actually makes no liturgical sense to do this.

Last year Canon Boardman combined the two separate Good Friday Liturgies into one. The two communities were asked to come together for a JOINT celebration at 3pm in St. Joseph's, because only the bigger church could accommodate the larger congregation. This coming together produced a memorable liturgy.

However, because there is now only one Good Friday Liturgy in St. Joseph's, other liturgical considerations come into play. In particular, it has affected the celebration of the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday evening. The ORDO for 2014, containing instructions for liturgical celebrations, (refer p. 271 Directory and Year Book 2014), states that: "The procession and repose of the Blessed Sacrament only takes place if the celebration of the Lord's Passion is to take place in the same building tomorrow". Thus the Mass of the Lord's Supper, with the Altar of Repose, also has to take place in St. Joseph's on Holy Thursday night.

So again this Holy Week both communities will be invited to come together in St. Joseph's as a PARISH, to celebrate the Sacred Triduum in its entirety. Canon Boardman hopes that BOTH communities will again play their part, by bringing to it their own respective gifts and their particular liturgical contributions as they did last year.

These are fundamental reasons why it has been necessary to review our celebration of the Sacred Triduum and to act accordingly. The changes that we have made merely reflect the mind of the Church.
