THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD.

In celebrating the feast of our Lord's baptism we are also commemorating our own baptism and our adoption as God's children. The Christmas celebration brought out the fact that the mystery of our divine adoption began at the Incarnation of the Christ-child (God-is-with-us). On today's feast we are reminded that it was on the day of our baptism that our adoption became a reality for each one of us. Today's liturgy recalls this gift of God and also reminds us of our obligation to live as children of God.

ST. JOSEPH'S STILL IN LOCKDOWN.

The Welsh Government has extended the present Lockdown situation until the end of January at the earliest. St. Joseph's church will therefore remain closed to a congregation for the duration and even beyond. All Masses are streamed live.

MASS INTENTIONS.

Please bear in mind when requesting Masses for specific days that the Mass Diary is running 6 weeks ahead and as there is only one Mass per day at the moment, your Mass intention may not be able to be said on the preferred date.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

Because of the present Lockdown, Saturday Confessions are now suspended until Lent. It is hoped that we will be able to reintroduce them during that special time, depending of course on the restrictions that are prevalent at the time.

CHAIN OF PRAYER FOR PARISHES.

This week it is the turn of St. Our Lady of Peace, Newbridge, with the parish priest Fr. Kevin Payne. Fr. Kevin serves two other churches besides Newbridge: The Sacred Heart Pontllanfraith, and St. Anthony of Padua and St. Clare Risca. Fr Kevin has serious health issues at the present time and yet carries on despite his problems. Please keep him in your prayers.

ST. MARY'S, DINAS POWYS. FLOOD DAMAGE.

There have been inevitable delays in contacting the Insurance Company over the Christmas period and registering our claim for flood damage. The flooding was extensive in the Dinas Powys/Sully area and many other buildings were affected including our Secondary School, St. Richard Gwyn. Notwithstanding this, we did eventually speak to the Insurance Company and a Loss Adjuster came out during the week.

The next step is to get the experts in to assess the extent of the damage – seen and unseen. Once they have done this, the task of restoring the church to its former state can begin. Mgr. Joe would like to thank the individuals who cleared the church after the flood. Their efforts are much appreciated.

From this coming Friday (15th Jan) and until we can reopen our church to a congregation, Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament is suspended and the Friday evening Mass will instead be **in the morning, at 9.30am**.

The Curriculum and Assessment (Wales) Bill currently progressing through the Senedd will have a detrimental impact on Catholic schools and Catholic families across Wales. This Bill seeks to end the rights of parents to withdraw their children from Relationship and Sex Education and Religious Education. This is a vital right for parents, especially Catholic parents who can't send their children to a Catholic school, as it ensures these sensitive subjects can be delivered in line with Catholic teaching.

Dear Father

Amidst the turmoil being caused to normal life by the spread of the COVID 19 pandemic, it is important to note that our schools and the education of our children are being profoundly affected not just by closures but also by the postponement of examinations.

Equally challenging, though overwhelmed by the current situation, is the Bill on curriculum with regard to the teaching of Religious Education and Sex and Relationship Education being championed by Welsh Government. If this Bill becomes law, it will have a profound effect on our ability to provide Catholic Education and therefore, ultimately, on the nature and purpose of our Catholic schools. The next three months provide the final opportunity to demand amendments to this Bill. The Catholic Bishops of Wales, the Catholic Education Service Welsh Department and Diocesan Education officials are working hard to challenge some of the proposals being made to the curriculum.

It is now up to priests, parishes, headteachers, governors and parents to make their voices heard. Once this opportunity passes, it will be too late.

Hence the article attached should be made available for distribution in parish newsletters, websites, school bulletins and direct mailshots to parents.

"WHOSE CHILDREN ARE THEY ANYWAY"



The Curriculum and Assessment (Wales) Bill currently before the Senedd will effectively remove the rights of parents as the first educators of their children. It will threaten the nature and purpose of Catholic schools as well as being an affront to devout Jews, Christians, Hindus, Sikhs and Muslims in Wales.

In the provisions concerning Human and Sex Education, the responsibility and privilege of parents to choose the right moment and language to discuss love and human sexuality with their children will be overridden by the imposition of a curriculum not in conformity with Christian teaching and that of many other faiths. The right of parents to remove their children from such classes will be removed.

The implications of this Bill places the right of the State before that of the parents of a child in such an important part of life. Should this ideologically driven Bill become law, it will remove the ancient freedoms and duties of parents in the education of their children. It would restrict freedom of conscience, freedom of expression, freedom of worship and conscientious objection. These are fundamental human rights which should be respected in a pluralistic society. They are not being upheld by this proposed legislation.

The assertion of power by Welsh Government in the lives of its citizens is not always malicious, but it cannot go unchallenged. The responses to the consultation on this Bill have been largely ignored. The First Minister of Wales and the Members of the Senedd need to be reminded very clearly that they were elected by us in order to represent us. We do not elect members of the Senedd to usurp our role as parents, grandparents and families. The rights and duties of parents are more significant and profound than party view and politics. This abuse of government power cannot go unchallenged. If we remain silent, there will be no appeal.
