SEA SUNDAY THIS WEEK 10TH JULY. (Apostleship of the Sea – Now "Stella Maris")

A second collection will be taken as you leave the church today. It is to help the Port Chaplains who work for Stella Maris and who in turn help the Seamen and women who spend their working lives on the ships that bring the goods and foodstuffs that we rely on and which fill our shopping baskets and lifestyles. Seafarers and fishers play a vital role in all our lives, but they often work in difficult, hazardous conditions too. In the last year, more crews have been abandoned by their employers than ever before. Others are reporting more stress and poorer mental health. Sea Sunday is Sunday 10th July. It is when the Church prays for all those who live and work at sea. Your support will make a big difference to seafarers and fishers in need. 
OUR PRAYERS FOR VOCATIONS BEARING FRUIT.

THE SYNOD OF BISHOPS 2023.

The parish response to the diocesan consultation was posted on the parish website and sent off to the diocese. The diocese then produced a document compiled from all the parishes and other groups in the archdiocese which was sent to the National Synthesis Team. This has also been posted on the parish website. They in turn produced a document from all the diocesan responses which was presented to the Bishops' Conference. The Bishops produced a document based on the national synthesis for submission to the Synod Office in Rome. This National document has also been posted on the parish website.

This will be considered along with the other national synthesis documents from around the world, and from these, the Synod Office will produce the *Instrumentum Laboris 1* for the work at the European (Regional) phase.

The Regional phase will continue the work begun here in England and Wales at the local, diocesan and national level. You can find these three documents on the Parish Website under Synod Responses parish/diocesan/national in the Main Menu.
