# THE LIFTING OF COVID RESTRICTIONS.

The governments in England, and in Wales, are preparing to "Lift the Covid Restrictions" in the near future, providing the "science" enables them to do so.

**"The Bishops of England and Wales** have reflected on how this decision will affect churchgoers. They recognise that some worshippers will be anxious to return to a full and free timetable of Mass and other services. Others will be anxious that safety measures will not be robust enough to ensure that rates of infection will not rise as a result of proximity in churches. Some priests fit into the category of "vulnerable" and will need to take this into account when discussing the process of further re-opening with their parishioners.

The advice of the bishops is to take a gradual and cautious approach to both the timing and the numbers enabled to come into church at any one time. This will need to be handled with tact and discretion so that a proper evaluation may be made over the summer months. The bishops are aware that the capacity to fulfil the Sunday obligation will continue to be problematic for some people in the short term. They propose that the **First Sunday of** Advent (28<sup>th</sup> November 2021) is the date when the whole Catholic community will be invited to come together again to celebrate the "Dies Domini" – the Day of the Lord".

Monsignor Joe says: "Risk assessments will have to be in place at each stage of any lifting of present restrictions. The bottom line has to be: "Is it safe to do this?"

# STREAMING AND BUFFERING.

It was reported to Monsignor Joe last weekend that the buffering of the signal during Mass on stream, was affecting the quality of the transmission for some people. This manifested itself in various ways: The image on the screen "froze"; or the sound was not in sync. Either way, the transmission was interrupted significantly and because some were unable to re-boot their devices, they had no alternative but to abandon their participation in the Mass. Mgr. Joe has spoken to the firm that installed the camera and broadband, and they are monitoring the strength of the signal and the other relevant readings. Hopefully this is something that will rectify itself. So far the readings are within the optimum range that were set when the camera and broadband were installed.
