Jeremiah's prophecy is uncompromising and must have challenged his hearers. Trusting in God alone rather than in human strength and wealth can seem like madness, but we are invited to do just that.

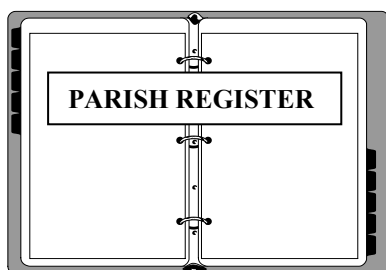

Is there freedom to exercise our particular gifts in the service of the Church?

Do I support the bishops and priests in arriving at their decisions?

These are just suggestions. This is a listening process. What other questions do you see as important?
