

### THE ROSARY AND THE FEAST OF THE ASSUMPTION

It is a great pity I think that the Rosary is no longer the prominent devotion that it used to be in our Catholic life. Many people today would not know their way around the rosary beads.

"The Assumption of our Lady into heaven" is the fourth glorious mystery of the rosary, and it is also the feast we celebrate today. Just as the joyful, sorrowful and glorious mysteries of the rosary cannot be taken in isolation from one another, so too this feast cannot be taken in isolation from the Church's liturgical year, which takes us on an annual journey from the Annunciation, through the life, death and resurrection of our Lord - to today's feast which celebrates Mary's unique sharing in the resurrection of her Son. On this feast of the Assumption of our Lady we celebrate our own destiny, because where she has gone we shall follow. The fifth and last mystery of the rosary is the Coronation of Our Lady in heaven and the glory of all the Saints, which points us towards the feast of All Saints on November 1st when we celebrate the destiny of redeemed humanity. The rosary tells us so much about the significance of this feast of the Assumption.


#### CATHOLIC PEOPLE
