SPUC WHITE FLOWER APPEAL 2023 - THIS WEEKEND.

The Society for the protection of unborn children (SPUC) will be holding its annual appeal this weekend. SPUC wants a world where abortion is unthinkable and is raising awareness of the widespread problem of abortion coercion. According to an independent Poll, 87% of GP's are concerned that the governments 'pill by post' scheme leaves women vulnerable to coerced abortion. SPUC is calling on the Prime Minister to condemn this abhorrent tragedy. Please be as generous as you can to help SPUC defend unborn babies and their mothers by highlighting this urgent crisis.

The annual White Flower Appeal is SPUC's largest single fundraising event and contributes an important part of its annual income. It allows us to plan confidently for the year ahead and to ensure that we can maintain our full range of educational and political work.

SPUC says: There are three areas of urgent need:

- We recently mounted judicial reviews in Northern Ireland, challenging the UK government's expansion of abortion against the will of the people and their devolved institutions. We expect a judgement for the second review to be reached by the court in October. Whatever the outcome in the courts, the battle for Northern Ireland's babies will go on. We are embarking on a massive programme of expansion of our operations in the Province, including new staff and volunteer structures.
- Freedom of assembly for pro-life witness is under serious threat. Legislation passed in Northern Ireland – clearly a testing ground – effectively criminalises prayer or offering assistance to

women within 150 metres of an abortion clinic. Similar legislation now proposed for Scotland carries a six-month to two-year prison sentence for merely praying outside clinics, and restrictions are also being explored by a number of local authorities in England. The removal of these freedoms paves the way for further restrictions on pro-life witness and pro-life speech. SPUC is mobilising our grassroots support base in opposition to this legislation.

3. Our youth programme *Project Truth* trains a cohort of youngsters and equips them to share the pro-life message on the streets of major cities. For many members of the public, this will be the first time they hear the truth about abortion and the development of unborn human life. This summer we held Project Truth events in seven cities; we would like to double this number in the coming year.

These life-saving projects all involve significant financial costs at a time when it is harder and harder for many people to offer support at their previous level. We need to raise at least £200,000 through the White Flower appeal this year in order to be able to put all our plans into action.

OCTAVE OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY 18th to the 25th January.

This Year's "Octave of prayer for Christian Unity is taking place from Wednesday18th to Wednesday 25th January inclusive. There will be daily ecumenical prayer sessions on each of the 8 days, from 1pm to 2pm, held this year at St. Peter's Old Cogan Church, the oldest church building in Penarth. St. Peter's can be accessed by road via Sully Road and there is a specious car park. Alternatively it is a pleasant 1 mile walk or cycle through Cosmeston Park. Lifts can also be arranged.
