LAY DOMINICANS IN CARDIFF.

The founder of the Order of Preachers (also known as Dominicans) was St. Dominic de Guzman (1170-1221). He was a man of infectious enthusiasm. Everything he did was marked by a deep faith and an immense intellectual curiosity. In St. Dominic, the yearning for union with God was inseparable from Action in the world. St. Dominic's way of life perfectly exemplifies the three dimensions of the Dominican vocation:

- The total dedication to God in prayer and contemplation.
- The cultivation of the mind through study.
- The outflow of charity into apostolic action.

Practising Catholics seeking to find out whether God is calling them to a Lay Dominican vocation are encouraged to get in touch with their nearest Fraternity where they can expect a warm welcome.

The frequency of meetings varies according to each Fraternity, but they normally take place at least once a month.

Should an enquirer decide that the Lay Dominican way of life is appropriate, he or she may request to be admitted. This normally happens after at least a year of attending the meetings regularly.
