Sleep-out for "Home4U".

Mary Ward and Roswitha Davies will again be taking part in the annual 'sleep-out' in aid of Home4U on the 21st/22nd June in the Hayes, Cardiff. Home4U provides temporary accommodation and money for sustenance to asylum seekers who would otherwise be destitute. Unable to return to their home countries and, while preparing a fresh claim for asylum, unable to receive benefits, they need our support. Currently Home4u are able to support four people, costing £650 a month. The sleep-out is their largest source of income. Please sponsor Mary and Roswitha, as you have so generously done before. They will be outside church after all Masses on 14th/15th June at St. Joseph's and on 21st.22nd June at St. Mary's
