WE WELCOME TWO NEW MEMBERS OF THE CHURCH INTO OUR PARISH COMMUNITIES.

This Friday (20th November) is a very special day for two special people. Ruth Leggett and Jeremy Aguinaldo will become full members of the Catholic Church. This should have happened at the Easter Vigil Mass last April, but it had to be postponed because of Coronavirus. Now that Wales has come out of Lockdown and the churches have reopened again (subject to current restrictions etc.) we are seizing the opportunity and celebrating the Sacraments of Christian Initiation with them in time for Christmas.

Ruth is married to David and they have three small children. They are regular attenders at the Sunday Mass in St. Mary's and have been actively involved in parish life "as a family" for some years. Ruth has already been baptized into the Anglican Communion and so she has no need of re-Baptism. She will simply need to go through the Rite of Reception into full Communion with the Catholic Church.

Jeremy is a young Filipino man who is getting married next year in the Philippines. He will receive Baptism first and then they will both be Confirmed, before receiving the Lord in the Eucharist for the very first time.

All this will take place during the 7pm public Mass on Friday evening this week. The Mass will be streamed live and so Jeremy's fiancée, along with others in the parish, will be able to watch it from the Philippines.

FR. AMBROSE WALSH RIP.

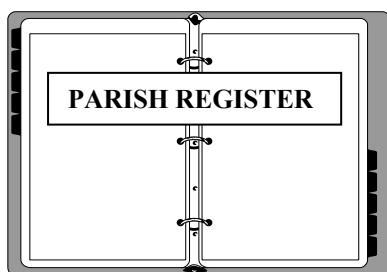

There will be a steward on hand to help and guide penitents to navigate the one-way system and to ensure that social distancing is observed.
