THE ASSUMPTION OF MARY – OUR DESTINY

It's a great shame, I think, that the Rosary no longer features as prominently as it used to do in our Catholic lives. It is too repetitious for some; too long winded for others; too boring for young people; and so it has been "ditched" and sadly many people today would not know their way around the Rosary Beads.

"The Assumption of Our Lady into heaven" is the 4th glorious mystery of the Rosary. It is also the feast we celebrate today. What we should bear in mind today is that just as each meditation of the Rosary cannot be taken in isolation from the others, so too today's feast is part of a greater whole. The 15 Mysteries of the Rosary take us from The Annunciation, through the Life, Death, and Resurrection of Our Lord, to the Feast of All Saints, celebrating the redemption of mankind.

So in praying the Rosary we follow Mary on her journey and we come face-to-face with our own destiny. Where Mary has gone before us, we too shall follow. In fact the 5th and last Glorious Mystery of the Rosary says it all: "The Coronation of Our Lady in heaven, and the glory of all the saints". Mgr. Joe

WE ARE OPENING FOR MASS NEXT WEEKEND

Mgr. Joe is delighted to announce that from next weekend, 22nd/23rd August, St. Joseph's Church will be open for the 5pm Mass on Saturday and the 11.15am Mass on Sunday. **This will be our starting point** and we will see where it takes us.

"OPENING OF CHURCH FOR PRAYER" FINISHES

Because of the re-introduction of Mass, **from Monday 24th August** the opening of St. Joseph's for private prayer on Mondays and Wednesdays will cease and will be replaced by a streamed Mass (without a congregation) at 9.30am respectively. **On Fridays from 28th August**, there will be an evening Mass (with a congregation) at 7pm, after exposition of the Blessed sacrament at 6.15pm.

THERE WON'T BE ROOM FOR EVERYONE

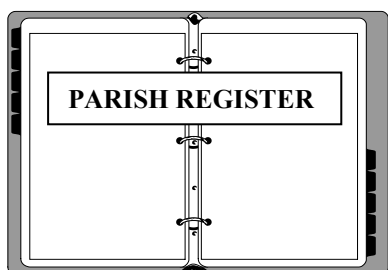
Because of social distancing, the number of parishioners who can fit into the church is greatly reduced. We have estimated that the maximum number we can accommodate is 50 persons per Mass (although this number could increase slightly if members of the same household sit together).

SYSTEM OF ENTRY

Different parishes have different systems. In Penarth, we are adopting a "first-come-first-in" method which will allow the church to fill up naturally until the limit is reached.

WHAT ABOUT THOSE UNABLE TO COME

For those unable to attend one of the Sunday Masses, we **will continue to stream the Masses from St. Joseph's**. For those fortunate enough to acquire a place, they should stagger their attendance at Mass for the following two weeks to give others a chance.

MASS IN ST JOSEPH'S NEXT WEEKEND.

If you intend coming to one of the Masses next weekend please bear the following points in mind:

- The church will be open 30mins before Mass.
- Arrive no later than 5mins before the start.
- Queue safely outside around the grass island.
- Observe social distancing.
- Use hand sanitizer provided on entry.
- Allow a steward to show you to your seat.
- Please remain in the pew you have been allocated.
- Keep a respectful silence before mass.
- Wait to be invited by the steward to move forward for Holy Communion
- Holy Communion is under one kind and must be received on the hand only.
- After receiving Holy Communion go immediately to the exit as directed by the steward.
- There is no collection during Mass.
- Offertory "baskets" will be placed at both exits for your offering on leaving.
- There is no music and no congregational singing.
- Hymn books and Mass sheets have been removed.
- Holy water stoups have been emptied and removed.
- There is no contact at the Sign of Peace.
- The toilet will remain closed and will only be available via the steward in an emergency.
- Following the Mass the church is closed to enable to stewards to clean and will only reopen for the next Mass.
