PREPARATION FOR A “SYNODAL” CHURCH.

Pope Francis launched the beginning of a world-wide consultation which is the first phase of preparation for the Synod of Bishops in 2023, which is entitled “For a Synodal Church: communion, participation and mission.” Pope Francis is calling the Church to rediscover its deeply synodal nature which requires us to discern how God is calling us to be Church in the Third Millennium.

Archbishop George says that “this process is very much in harmony with all that we are already trying to do in our diocese, and which can support us in our desire to be more missionary and outward-looking.”

How best to carry out this consultation will vary from parish to parish; from diocese to diocese. The Cardiff clergy have already met as a deanery, to discuss the best way forward. It seems logical that the synodal process is linked with the call of the Bishops to recognise the “Day of the Lord” once again, when Catholics will be encouraged to come back to their Sunday Mass from the first Sunday of Advent.

WORLD MISSION SUNDAY- NEXT WEEK.

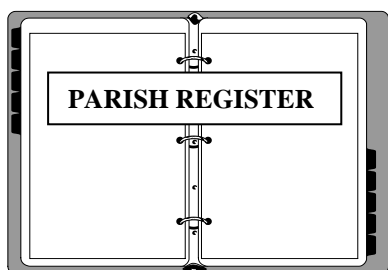
