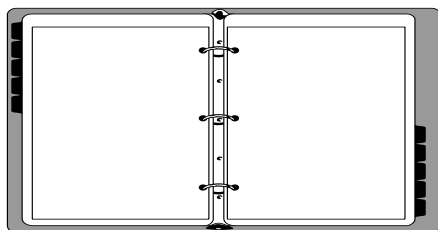

Memorial Mass in St. Philip Evans Church

This Mass is at the request of Syrian parishioners in memory of **Rev. Frans van der Lugt SJ**, a Dutch Jesuit shot dead in the Syrian city of Homs last month. He was said to be the last European working to help the besieged residents of that city. A short reflection on his life will be given by Deacon Richard Withers, our diocesan representative for Aid to the Church in Need (ACN). A collection will also be taken for the work of ACN in Syria. All are welcome to come.
