COMING OUT OF COVID RESTRICTIONS.

The First Minister spoke this week about a tentative approach to the lifting of most of the restrictions on 7th August. It comes with the proviso that the "science" will enable them to do so when the time comes.

This cautious approach seems to be the sensible thing to do when the infection rates are on the increase. We will monitor the situation carefully and respond accordingly. Monsignor Joe has said that risk assessments will have to be in place at each stage of any lifting of present restrictions. The bottom line has to be: "Is it safe to do this?"

POPE FRANCIS SAYS:

"We will not emerge from the present crisis as we were before, but either better or worse. And "God willing..... this may prove not to be just another tragedy of history from which we learned nothing..... If only we might keep in mind all those elderly persons who died for lack of respirators... If only this immense sorrow may not prove useless, but enable us to take a step forward towards a new style of life. If only we might discover once for all that we need one another, and that in this way our human frailty can experience a rebirth" (Fratelli Tutti, 35). No one is saved alone. We are all indebted to one another. We are all brothers and sisters.

The second collection last weekend for the Apostleship of the Sea (now Stella Maris) raised a total of £513.90. This

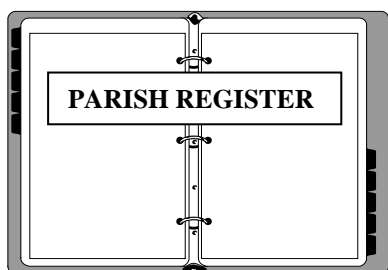

ST. PHILIP EVANS & ST. JOHN LLOYD. RELICS.

Following the identification and authentication of the relics of our two great Cardiff Martyrs recently, the Jesuit authorities at Stonyhurst College have agreed to the possibility of the relics of our martyr saints being brought to Cardiff in the autumn. At present the plans are at an early stage and a small committee is being established to organise the events surrounding this important historical and devotional undertaking. Places associated with their ministry and martyrdom will obviously be the focus of attention, but parishes and schools dedicated to their name will also hopefully be on the itinerary. The projected date for this "Pilgrimage of the Martyrs" is the final week of October, coinciding with the Feast of the Canonisation of the Welsh and English Martyrs on 25th October 2021.

The Holy Father has designated **next weekend** (25th July) as the first World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly. Pope Francis concludes his message to them as follows: "Dear Grandmother, dear grandfather, dear elderly friends, "I am with you always" (Mt. 28:20): this is the promise the Lord made to his disciples before he ascended into heaven. They are the words that he repeats to you today, dear grandfathers and grandmothers and dear elderly friends. "I am with you always" are also the words that I, as Bishop of Rome and an elderly person like yourselves, would like to address to you on this first World Day of Grandparents and the elderly. The whole Church is close to you – to us – and cares about you, loves you and does not want to leave you alone. [More to come next week].
