THE CLERGY RETIREMENT FUND THIS WEEKEND

The **Clergy Retirement Fund** was established in 2005. The Fund has been **adversely affected** by a number of factors in recent years. The unpredictable events which are taking place in the financial markets have meant a **significant loss of interest to the fund**, in addition to **increasing costs**. A second collection will be taken **throughout the Diocese TODAY**. The **envelopes issued last week can be put on the plate**. Offerings by tax payers can be increased by 25p in each £1 by completing the declaration. The appeal will be extended so envelopes can be **returned in the next couple of weeks**. Thank you.

ANNUAL MASS FOR DECEASED CLERGY

When did you last pray for the souls of those priests or deacons who served your parish but have now died? **Once a year**, the **priests of our diocese** gather at the **Cathedral in Cardiff** (Charles Street) to pray for all those clergy who belonged to the Archdiocese of Cardiff and have now passed into God's hands. You are welcome to join the prayers as part of the congregation at **12.45pm THIS Tuesday 20th November**.

SECOND WORLD DAY OF THE POOR TODAY – 18th NOVEMBER

Last year, **Pope Francis** announced that the 33rd Sunday of each year would be **World Day of the Poor** in the Catholic Church. He invited Catholics across the world to meet those in poverty IN ENCOUNTER: In Penarth and Dinas Powys, the Day is an opportunity to **PRAY** and reflect on the ways we support the poor – **Home Access, Home4u, Reaching the Unreached (India), SVP** and the many and varied appeals we respond to during the year. In the words of Pope Francis: "The poor evangelise us and help us, each day, to discover the beauty of the Gospel".

NOVEMBER DEAD LISTS – Month of the Holy Souls. During **November**, daily Masses are said for the Holy Souls. In particular for those named in the November Dead Lists which are placed on the altar. **Special envelopes are available at the back of both churches for your lists.** You do not have to enclose money in your envelope, but if you choose to do so, it will be donated to **Aid to the Church in Need (ACN)**. This organisation is a **Pontifical Foundation** which helps **persecuted Christians** all over the world. They are in **Iraq**, helping Christians return to their homeland; they are in **Syria and Lebanon, Egypt, Nigeria, Pakistan** and **parts of Sudan, India** and the **Philippines**. **China, North Korea and Eritrea** are also on the radar of ACN. In a recent report, ACN stated that, between 2015 and 2017, the **situation for Christians had declined** in those countries as a **result of violence and oppression**. The one exception was **Saudi Arabia** where the situation was already so bad, it could **scarcely get any worse**. A few copies of the ACN booklet **Persecuted but never forgotten** are left at the back of both churches. Please take one.
