RE-OPENING OF ST JOSEPH'S FOR PRAYER.

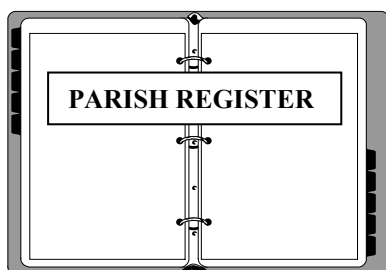
Mgr Joe is pleased to announce that he and his "team" have completed and submitted the various risk assessments regarding Health & Safety and Covid-19 precautions, and we have now received the official certificate from the Archbishop, authorizing us to open the church for private prayer. We shall therefore be opening the church for one hour per day three times a week (In line with our neighboring parishes). The timings will be 11am until 12 noon on Mondays and Wednesdays, and then 6.30pm till 7.30pm on Fridays, with exposition of the Blessed Sacrament.

The starting date is THIS MONDAY, 20TH JULY.

Please read all the signs and follow the one-way system when entering the church. Stewards will be there to help you. Hand sanitizer is available on entering and exiting the building. Face coverings are not compulsory at the moment but if you wish to wear one please ask the steward. Please note that the toilet facilities in the church are closed and are not in use. This is to comply with public health guidelines.

Archbishop George asks us to remember the following intentions in our prayers, as we re-open St. Joseph's.

1. Thanksgiving for our safe passage through these difficult times.
2. Remembering NHS workers and Key workers.
3. Those who have died, the bereaved and the sick.
4. Those struggling with worries about money + jobs.
5. That we may soon be in a position to celebrate Mass together again.

CAFOD CORONAVIRUS APPEAL - URGENT.

"For families living in crowded camps in places like Yemen, Syria and Somalia, Covid-19 poses a deadly threat. In Yemen alone, so many have succumbed to the virus that the gravediggers are now overwhelmed. These are the words of the DISASTERS EMERGENCY COMMITTEE (DEC) of which CAFOD is a member. DEC has launched a National Appeal on TV and through other channels of communication to highlight the Appeal. CAFOD says: "Thanks to generous support from the Catholic community, we are already working across 26 countries, to prevent the virus' spread, and limit the food shortages it has caused in the poorest communities. But there is so much more to be done. The needs are immense, long term, complex and evolving, and so our response needs to be large scale and multifaceted". Remember these people have no health system to fall back on.
