PEACE SUNDAY – TODAY SUNDAY 20th JAN

The **Bishops of England and Wales** invite us to make a day of prayer for peace and to reflect on the theme **Pope Francis** has chosen for the annual **World Day of Peace** with the challenging title: '*Good politics serves peace*'. The Gospel for **this Sunday** gives us a most wonderful basis for **reflection on our calling to work together for peace** (and to get involved in the political process, too, in order to seek that goal). We meet Jesus, his mother and his disciples at the **Wedding Feast of Cana**. He shares in our **human joys** – the joys of family, the **joys of human love** and the **pledge of fidelity** that unites one heart to another. But he also shares in our **sorrows** – Mary's cry: 'They have no wine'; the realisation that our own resources **are run dry**, our **bonds of love prove fragile**, our promises are all **too easily betrayed**. Today we remember and pray for the work of Pax Christi which is rooted in the gospel, by challenging Britain's involvement in the global arms trade; by questioning the morality of the new technologies such as drone warfare – both here in the UK and internationally - through our status at the UN.

ENROLMENT MASS FOR CONFIRMANDI

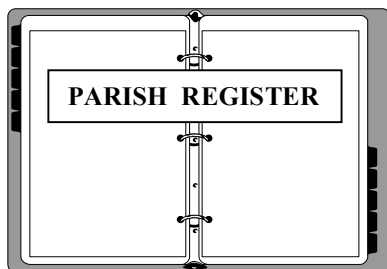

THE ARCHDIOCESAN LITURGY COMMISSION HAS WRITTEN THE FOLLOWING:

Two years ago, for the Centenary of the Archdiocese, the Liturgy Commission was asked to produce a 'Cycle of Prayer' for the Parishes of the Diocese. The hope was that this might develop a sense of connection and shared mission between the Parishes and throughout the Diocese as a whole.

The need for such mutuality has not gone away. As individual parishes struggle, we need more and more the prayer and support of each other. So the Commission again offers a cycle of prayer for Parishes of the Diocese. We shall be including the names of particular parishes, their clergy and other institutions in that parish week by week.

Last week, it was the turn of Our Lady and St. Illtyd, Llantwit Major, with St. Cadoc's, Cowbridge. We prayed for the Parish Priest Fr. Mark Rowles, and for UWC Atlantic College.

This week it is the turn of: Our Lady and Saint Patrick's, Maesteg, and Saint Robert of Newminster, Aberkenfig. We pray for the Parish Priest Fr. Edmund Neizer, for Maesteg Community Hospital, Glanrhyd Hospital, Maesqwyn Hospital, Saint Mary and Saint Patrick Primary School and Saint Robert's Primary School.

Each parish community is part of the Diocesan "Family" and it is a reminder to us that we are part of a bigger wheel, and we are all in communion with +George, our Archbishop, one in mind and heart, in the service of Jesus Christ.

PARISH ADVISORY COUNCIL ELECTIONS – COMING SOON

The Parish Advisory Council (**PAC**) consists of 12 elected members and 5 ex-officio members. It is a **consultative body** and advises Canon Joe **on Parish matters** and on decisions he has to make. The Council meets about 6 times a year. Elected members serve for 3 years, after which time, they are eligible to serve a second term of 3 years and can apply for re-election. After serving two 3-year terms, they have to step down for at least one year.

This year, **two elected members** have completed two terms and **have to step down**. They are Christiane Cantlay and Joyce Harding. We are grateful to them for their dedication and generosity of spirit. They have to be replaced. **Any parishioner can be nominated** to serve on the PAC. Nomination forms will be available **from Sunday 27th January (next week) until Sunday 10th February**.
