PARISH ADVISORY COUNCIL – NOMINATIONS OPEN FROM THIS WEEKEND.

The Parish Advisory Council (PAC) consists of 12 elected members and 5 ex-officio members. It is a **consultative body** and advises Canon Joe on **Parish matters** and on decisions he has to make. The Council meets about 5 times a year. Elected members serve for 3 years, after which time, they are eligible to serve a second term of 3 years and can apply for re-election. After serving two 3-year terms, they have to step down for one year.

This year, only **one elected member** has completed two terms and **has to step down**. **3 other elected members** have completed their first term of 3 years and **can apply for re-election**, if they so wish. They are welcome to do so. Likewise, **any parishioner can be nominated** to serve on the PAC. Nomination forms are now available from the sacristies of both churches.

Nominations will close on Sunday 5th February after the Evening Mass in St. Mary's.
