WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS

TODAY. GOOD SHEPHERD SUNDAY (4th Sunday of Easter). THIS SUNDAY is a day of Prayer for Vocations to the Priesthood and Consecrated Life. 'Behind every vocation' ... there is always (the) prayer of someone' (Pope Francis reminds us). We have seen the fruits of our prayers as two of our five students in Seminary will be ordained priests this summer for this diocese: **Deacon Nick Williams** and **Deacon** Robert James. From the three remaining students, one will be ordained a 'transitional' deacon on 16th June; he is Laurence Bryce. He will be ordained a priest next year. The other two students, Elliot Hanson and Dale Cutlan, are following in his footsteps. Please keep them in your prayers. There will be a **SECOND COLLECTION TODAY** for the Priests' Training Fund (PTF). It takes £20,000 to train a student per year (over 7 years). The PTF needs topping up each year to meet the costs. Special envelopes are again available this weekend for your contribution. Tax payers can complete the Gift Aid declaration. We must continue to pray for vocations. We can never sit back and be complacent. Remember our senior clergy will have to be replaced one day.

DO YOU KNOW SOMEONE WHO IS IN HOSPITAL? PLEASE READ THIS

Do you know someone who is in hospital? – either in UHW, Llandough Hosp, or Marie Curie, Holme Tower? IT IS VITAL THAT YOU TELL THE PARISH CLERGY IMMEDIATELY (see phone numbers in left hand column) OR THE PARISH HOSPITAL CHAPLAINCY CO-ORDINATOR (on 029 20515309) OR UHW CHAPLAINCY ON 029 2074 3230. Otherwise the chaplaincy team will not know that the person is there. Due to the Data Protection Act, the team no longer has access to the list of Admissions. If no one from the Church has been to see the person in hospital, it is because they do not know the person is there.
