FIRST WORLD DAY OF THE POOR IS COMING – 19th NOVEMBER 2017

Last June, **Pope Francis** announced that the 33rd Sunday of each year would be **World Day of the Poor** in the Catholic Church. He invited Catholics across the world to meet those in poverty IN ENCOUNTER: "It is my wish that, Christian communities will make every effort to create moments of encounter and friendship, solidarity and concrete assistance." The Pope tells us that the Day is **to prepare us for the celebration of the Feast of Christ the King the following Sunday**. He hopes that the Day will help us to reflect on the fact that if there are destitute people on our streets there can be no justice or social peace. He says that we should not think of the poor simply as the beneficiaries of our generosity, but as **a way of encountering Christ**.

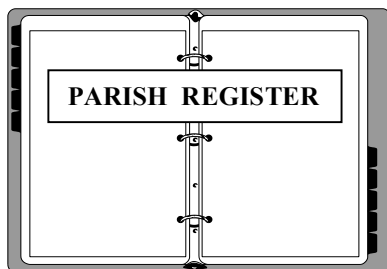
MASS IN WELSH

THE NATIONAL COMMEMORATION OF THE 500th ANNIVERSARY OF THE REFORMATION IN WALES

On **Tuesday 31st October at 11am Archbishop George Stack** will lead Cytûn's service of commemoration for the **500th anniversary** of the beginning of the Reformation at **St. David's Catholic Cathedral, Cardiff**. It will be followed by **refreshments at 12 noon** and a **lecture on *The Catholicity of the Reformation*** by Professor Densil Morgan at **2pm**, both in the **Cornerstone**. It is an opportunity for Christians to **come together to help heal the divisions of the past** and to focus on what unites us, not what divides us. RTU COFFEE MORNING – The RTU coffee morning is on **Saturday 11th Nov in St. Joseph's Hall**. ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY (SVP) 4th-5th NOVEMBER PRE-CHRISTMAS COLLECTION

This year we are having to take the annual SVP collection earlier than usual. SVP is an **international voluntary organisation** dedicated to tackling poverty and helping the disadvantaged with **practical assistance**. Our own St. Joseph's & St. Mary's group **visit the sick, the poor and the lonely** in our community at home, in nursing homes and in hospital. They very much reflect and answer the call for our **Faith to be in action**. Your donation will be gratefully received for the work of our local group who will bring some Christmas cheer where it is most needed.

GOING INTO HOSPITAL?

Waiting to go into hospital? Do please let your parish priest know in plenty of time. He will be pleased to celebrate the Sacrament of the Sick with you or any pastoral support you need. This is preferable to leaving it until you are in hospital. The small team of parish priests who currently provide 24/7 emergency cover in the Cardiff hospitals are under a great deal of pressure, so unfortunately there is no guarantee that one is always available at any particular time. On the same theme, if you know of any Catholic already in hospital, who needs or might like a visit or sacramental support, please continue to leave details with the Cardiff & Vale Hospital Chaplaincy on 2074 3230. NOVEMBER DEAD LISTS

During November, daily Masses are said for the Holy Souls. In particular for those named in the November Dead Lists which are placed on the altar. **Special envelopes are available at the back of both churches for your lists.** You do not have to enclose money in your envelope, but if you choose to do so, it will be donated to the **INTERNATIONAL REFUGEE TRUST (IRT)** whose projects we have supported in previous years. In the words of Steven Smith MBE, Chief Executive of IRT, "In Uganda, the impact of our Step-Up programme on impoverished rural families, whose lives and culture were completely shattered by terror groups, is breath-taking. And in South Sudan and Jordan, we remain in awe of the unselfish dedication, and sheer bravery of the Missionary Sisters, who continue to care for the poor, and the dispossessed, without counting the personal cost to them."
