#### ST PETER HAS THE KEYS

If you look at the two statues in St. Joseph's, Penarth, above the sanctuary, St. Peter is the one on the right hand side, holding the keys, signifying his authority.

When people of my generation were young, it was at the age of 21yrs that you were treated as an adult for the first time. Your 21st birthday was a Rite of Passage, and this was symbolised by being given the "key of the door". Indeed 21st birthday cards in those days, inevitably had a key on them in some shape or form. The key symbolised your new status. In the tradition of Scripture however, whenever a person was entrusted with keys, the keys were a symbol of his authority. In today's Old Testament reading, Shebna, the master of the palace, is dismissed from office and Eliakim is appointed in his place. "I entrust him with your authority" (said the Lord). "I place the key of the House of David on his shoulder ".

The words spoken by Jesus in today's gospel reading are quoted in Latin all around St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. "Tu es Petrus". You are Peter, and on this Rock I will build my Church". Part of that inscription goes on to read "And I will give you the keys of the Kingdom of Heaven". On the Rock of Peter, Jesus established his Kingdom on earth; the Church would be the key and the KEYHOLDER would be Peter and his successors. In the case of Peter, his was to be a leadership role, invested with the authority of Christ himself. So although the Church speaks with a human voice, it speaks with divine authority, and it must be heard. Mgr. Joe.

## WELCOME BACK TO ST. JOSEPH'S

This weekend we will celebrate Holy Mass together for the first time since the Lockdown began in March and we rejoice. It has taken us more time than some to arrive at this day but the major consideration had to be the safety of parishioners in the midst of this pandemic crisis. Although some restrictions have been lifted, the virus is still with us and the threat isn't going away any time soon.

So although we open our church once more for Mass, things are not the same as they were. This is not a return to "normal" and carry on as before. Strict procedures are in place and the stewards are there to see that they are carried out for your safety and wellbeing.

Not everyone will be able to come to Mass. Because of social distancing, we estimate a congregation of 50 persons only, although this can grow a little if members of the same household sit together. They should note that there will be a different system for receiving Holy Communion and for exiting the church at the end of Mass. This will be explained from the altar by the priest. The toilets will only be available via the stewards in an emergency. However the Mass will be deliberately shorter than normal so that People are not in church for too long a time.

For those who cannot come, the Mass will continue to be streamed live into your homes. Remember the Bishops' Conference has lifted the Sunday Obligation and so no one is under any pressure to attend. Please see the Mass Times on the back page of the Gazette and note which are with a congregation and which are without.
