PROHIBITION OF NUCLEAR WEAPONS.

The Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales, and that of Scotland, have called on the UK Government to forsake its nuclear arsenal, asking it to honour the UN Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons that was ratified last year and which came into force on January 22nd 2021. "The resources spent on manufacturing, maintaining and upgrading these weapons of mass destruction should be reinvested to alleviate the suffering of the poorest and most vulnerable members of our society, for the Common Good of

all". The Bishops also underlined: "The opportunity to re-focus on genuine peace-making rooted in dialogue, justice, respect for human dignity, and care for our planet".

The Government was also implored to strengthen arms control regulations, tackling the manufacture and sale of other weapons which continue to destroy so many lives. During such a dark time regarding worldwide health, this call by our Bishops strikes an encouraging note of hope and positivity in our world.
