Fr. Anthony Chantry, Missio's National Director in England and Wales says:

"Celebrating World Mission Sunday is so important and relevant in these times. If we are to emerge from all our present global problems stronger in our commitment to Jesus and the coming of his Kingdom of peace and justice, we must work together, helping and supporting each other across the world. World Mission Sunday is about expressing the solidarity that comes from being the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church.

A second collection will be taken at all Masses. A second receptacle will be placed at the back of church for "World Mission."

#### **UN CLIMATE TALKS IN GLASGOW NEXT WEEK**

The Conference of Parties (COP26) is the 26<sup>th</sup> United Nations Climate Conference, which is set to meet in Glasgow from 31<sup>st</sup> October 2021 to 12<sup>th</sup> November. It will be attended by leaders from over 200 countries to discuss climate change and how to tackle the global ecological crisis.

In the run up to COP26 and specifically on the last Sunday of October (ie. next week), the Bishops of England and Wales are asking us to pray that the leaders work together for positive outcomes for people and the planet.

The Bishops, in partnership with Cafod, have produced a prayer card for use in the parish and in the home. A copy of the prayer is attached to this gazette. The actual prayer cards will be given out at Masses next weekend at the start of the Conference.

#### CORONAVIRUS IS STILL WITH US.

We have been hearing on the news all week how the covid-19 virus has been spreading its wings again and has been infecting increasing numbers of people. The NHS is worried that another peak could be exacerbated by a similar spread of the influenza virus leading to a winter crisis. Thankfully we have the vaccines to afford us some measure of protection but covid-19 can still be passed on of course and this is why we have to protect the most vulnerable in our community, by continuing to exercise caution where necessary and of course by using our common sense.

Mgr. Joe is as anxious as anyone to "turn the corner" and to bring back some aspects of parish life that we have had to do without and which we have missed so much for such a long time. However, he cannot do this just yet with the threat of further restrictions a distinct possibility should things get worse over the next few weeks. **We must wait and see**.

#### PREPARATION FOR THE SYNOD OF BISHOPS.

On October 10th, Pope Francis launched the beginning of a world-wide consultation in preparation for a special Synod of Bishops in 2023. The Synod is entitled "For a Synodal Church: communion, participation and mission." (The word Synodal means "walking or journeying together). "The Archbishop has recently appointed Madeleine Walters to lead the archdiocese in the process of SYNOD 2021-2023. We have been asked to consult our parishioners. individually and in their groupings, and ask them to address certain questions that will then be discussed at the Synod of Bishops in 2023. The questions revolve around "What experience of Church has the person-in-the-pew had pre-covid, and what vision of Church does that person have for the post-covid Church. There will be more guidance given as the first phase of the consultation progresses. This is the first time that that a Synod has invited the laity to participate and to contribute. There are huge obstacles at the present time in communicating to the parish as a whole and Mgr Joe and his team need to work out the best way forward.

COP26 is the United Nations climate change conference being held in Glasgow between 31st October and 12th November.
