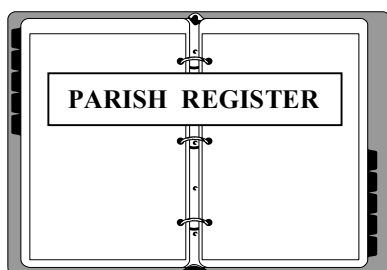
#### MISSIO – APF RED BOXES

## APOSTLESHIP OF THE SEA – FORTHCOMING COLLECTION

**Sunday 9<sup>th</sup> July is Sea Sunday when the Church prays for all those who live and work at sea.** There will be **second collection** for the Apostleship of the Sea (AoS), the official maritime welfare agency of the Catholic Church. It **supports seafarers** who visit our ports both, **practically and spiritually**. Our daily life depends on the maritime industry and the sea. 90% of world trade is transported by sea. Around the world, nearly 1.2 million seafarers, many from developing nations, work on board 50,000 merchant ships carrying food, clothing, furniture, petrol and many other products. Seafarers have one of the hardest and most dangerous jobs in the world. They can spend months at sea, working long hours, living in cramped conditions and battling storms and gales. They see little of their families and, when they arrive in a port, they know no one. **This is where Apostleship of the Sea port chaplains and ship visitors come in.** When they go on board a ship they have one question for the crew: **How can I help?** They offer the hand of friendship, listen to the concerns of the seafarers they meet and try through small gestures to attend to some of their needs.
