WHAT DOES THE LOCK DOWN MEAN FOR US?

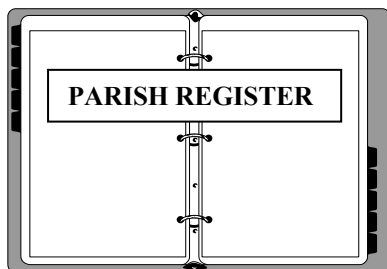
From last Friday evening (23rd October), there will be no Masses with a congregation until at least the week beginning Monday 9th November. Instead Masses will be streamed live to our website. Otherwise the times of weekend Masses from St. Joseph's will remain the same, ie. 5pm Saturday, and 9.30am Sunday. The exception is the 11.15am Mass in St. Mary's, Dinas Powys on Sunday morning, which will be cancelled for the duration of the lockdown. Weekday Mass will be streamed from St. Joseph's on Mondays and Wednesdays as usual at 9.30am. On Friday evenings there will be no Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament before Mass which will be streamed at 7pm.

WORLD MISSION SUNDAY. "MISSIO".

Mgr Joe had deferred the collection for Missio until this weekend because of its proximity to the CAFOD Harvest Fast Day. However, because of the current lockdown it has now been cancelled and we will have to look out for another opportunity when our churches reopen.

THE ROSARY DURING LOCKDOWN.

The Rosary and Litany of Our Lady will still be recited before weekday Masses in St. Joseph's during October. It will begin half an hour before the streamed morning Masses on Mondays and Wednesdays (ie 9.00am) and at 6.30pm on Fridays, before the 7.00pm streamed Mass.

NOVEMBER DEAD LISTS. HOLY SOULS.

During November, daily Masses will be offered especially for the deceased loved ones of parishioners. A symbolic number of **empty** November envelopes will be placed in the box on the altar from November 2nd in both our churches. **They represent the envelopes and lists that you brought in last year. So if you brought in an envelope last year, with your list of deceased loved ones, then one of the empty ones this year is for you and yours. There is no further action required.**

ON-LINE GIVING TO THE PARISH.

As we face another lockdown in Wales with our churches closed once more along with non-essential shops and services, we have to find other ways of giving to the parish in order to maintain a source of income. More and more we are becoming a "cashless" society as many people prefer to use their cards or their phones, rather than cash, when purchasing goods and services. Many parishes have given people the opportunity to donate to their parish via an on-line link. We too have set up such a link via the Archdiocese, and all monies go directly into St. Joseph's and St. Mary's bank account. It is fully secure. There is no obligation for you to use this feature, but the facility is there if you want it.
