Day of Prayer for Vocations to the Priesthood and Consecrated Life TODAY Sunday 26th April There will be a second collection TODAY for the PTF (Priests Training Fund).

Today, however, we affirm the importance of the ordained priesthood at the heart of the sacramental life of the Church. The call to priesthood is as real today as it has ever been, although it may be more difficult to hear in a world opaque to the things of God. That is one reason why our homes, schools, parishes, colleges and chaplaincies need to be 'schools of prayer' in which young people in particular learn how to listen to God's word and draw more closely to Him on a daily basis.

The Bishop of Wrexham, Rt. Rev. Peter M. Brignall will lead the pilgrimage. The celebration begins with Confessions from 1.30pm. The Holy Rosary Procession is at 2.30pm. The Holy Eucharistic Celebration is at 3.00pm. After a tea/coffee break, Benediction and the Blessing of the Sick will take place.
