SEASON OF CREATION AND THE AMAZON.

In 2019 we saw terrible pictures of fires in the Amazon. Instinctively we knew that this was important for the whole world. The Amazon rainforest is vital in stabilising the global climate as an absorber of carbon dioxide and an emmiter of oxygen. It is under threat from illegal logging, mining and agriculture. It is also home of many indigenous people. Invalide, at the centre of CAFOD harvest fast day this year, is a grandmother. For the last 19 years she has been on the frontline of the struggle to protect our common home. She lives in a small patch of rainforest in one of the most deforested regions of the Brazilian Amazon. Pope Francis has said that the health of our planet depends on the health of the rainforest, yet every year thousands of acres are burned so that land can be cleared for cattle ranching. Invadide's home has been burned and her trees and crops destroyed by such fires. She has replanted and human rights lawyers are fighting in the courts the right for Invadide and her community to stay and protect the fragile piece of the Amazon they call home.

O Creator God, protect all those striving to protect the earth. Strengthen them in their work and inspire us all to be guardians of your precious gift of creation. Amen.

THE THREAT OF ASSISTED SUICIDE.

A second reading of the Assisted Dying Bill is expected in the House of Lords. The Bishops' Conference has made an urgent appeal for the faithful to write to peers, particularly if they have stories they are able to share, to give voice to the concerns and fears of disabled people and to offer personal stories of those with medical expertise in end-of-life care. Please read the letter from Bishop John Sherrington, Auxiliary Bishop of Westminster, to his brother Bishops, which is attached to this gazette and in which he emphasises the gravity and urgency of the situation.

GOING BACK TO "THE DAY OF THE LORD".

The Bishops of England and Wales are conscious that the lifting of the Sunday Obligation, which has been allowed during the pandemic, cannot go on indefinitely. For the moment however, they are conscious that the Covid-19 virus is still circulating in society. It is their continuing judgement therefore that, whereas it may not possible or safe at the present time for all the faithful to attend Mass on a Sunday, thus fulfilling their duty to God, it is hoped that it will be possible for all Catholics in England and Wales to fulfil this most important Church precept - that of the Sunday obligation - by the First Sunday in Advent 2021. In the meantime, all Catholics are asked to do their best to participate in the celebration of the weekly Sunday Mass and to reflect deeply on the centrality of Sunday worship in the life of the Church.

Dear Brother Bishops

In the next weeks, we face an unprecedented attack on the sanctity of life with Baroness Meacher's 'Assisted Dying Bill 2021' which received its First Reading in the House of Lords and is due its Second Reading with full debate on Friday 15th October. The term 'Assisted Dying' is euphemistic, the truth is that this bill seeks to introduce Assisted Suicide. If legalised, this Bill would allow a terminally ill adult, with less than 6 months to live, to be assisted in committing suicide.

The context of the debate is fundamentally different from the Marris Bill in 2015. Dignity in Dying are running a vigorous campaign, which is highly mobilised. They have some national papers on side and are using strong, personal and emotional narratives to win hearts and minds. They also have a high presence on social media and are encouraging their supporters to write to Peers. Those in favour of the bill are making good use of language to confuse the issue and call it a compassionate and caring approach to obscure the actual reality and consequences of such legislation. As Pope Francis has said, 'Physician-assisted suicide is part of a "throwaway culture" that offers a "false compassion" and treats a human person as a problem... True compassion does not marginalize anyone, nor does it humiliate and exclude — much less considers the disappearance of a person as a good thing.' He criticised 'those who hide behind an alleged compassion to justify and approve the death of a patient.'

We continue to argue for good palliative care and its important values, including spiritual ones, which are part of this approach. However, this language is being manipulated by *Dignity in Dying*. Importantly, at this stage we need to argue the dangers of the introduction of Assisted Suicide, which includes the safety of people who are vulnerable due to external pressures, and later liberalisation of the law which is evidenced by other countries which have introduced Assisted Suicide. Many voices from the world of disability-rights and other allies are also

very fearful and fighting this bill. The Bill would also fundamentally change the relationship between the Healthcare Professionals and the Patient from treatment and care to providing the lethal means to commit suicide.

It is possible that the Bill will pass to Committee Stage without a vote in October and be returned to the Lords for Third Reading and then, if passed, be sent to the Commons. There will be pressure on the Government to provide time for this.

To prepare for these events, I ask your engagement and that of your dioceses over these next weeks. First, to ask you to call people to pray that the Bill will be defeated. Second, to ask that people write to the Peers from their personal experience and share stories which will argue the reasons for opposing the Bill as well as narrate the importance of precious time during the final stages of life. Healthcare and legal professionals should write giving reasons why they oppose the Bill. This needs to be done before the Second Reading on 15th October. Peers engage with personal correspondence and not to campaigns. Third, to ask parishioners to engage and share stories and reasons against the Bill on social media.

In this way, the Church will be a prophetic voice: a voice of clarity and truth amidst the great confusion around this Bill.

The Secretariat of the Bishops' Conference is engaged and will be providing further resources over the next weeks. A first briefing is attached.
