INVASION OF THE UKRAINE.

(Extract of a message from His Beatitude Sviatoslav, Patriarch of the Greek Catholic Church in the Ukraine). "Today we call out in prayer to the Almighty Creator, with a special appeal for wisdom for those entrusted with making important decisions for society, in whose hands lies the fate of humanity. We ask the Heavenly Father for assistance in restoring a just peace on Ukrainian land.

We pray especially for those who defend Ukraine, who in these days are for us an example of loving sacrifice and dedicated service to their people. May the merciful Lord protect them from every danger and crown their efforts with the victory of truth and good.

We call for the gracious blessing of a loving God and Creator upon Ukraine and its people". Amen.

COVID UPDATE: "LEAVE-A-SPACE" CARDS.

Face coverings are currently still mandatory in indoor public places in Wales. However, we anticipate that very soon, in line with England, they will only be legally required in retail, on public transport, and in health and care settings. This means that when this restriction is lifted, it will be for people to make up their own minds whether they wish to wear a mask or not in the church.

However, there will be some people, who may not be comfortable with being too close to a person not wearing one. If this is the case then there will be "Leave-a-Space" cards available that you can place on the pew next to you.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Casimir. 4th March.

As in Wales this week we celebrate the feast of our Patron Saint, it is just as well to be acquainted with the Patron Saints of other countries. St. Casimir is the Patron Saint of Lithuania, since his family were very involved in bringing the faith into that country which is one of the Baltic States.

Born in October 1458 in Cracow in Poland, he was one of the royal princes of Poland. His family, as well as promoting the faith, fought against the Turks as they tried to infiltrate Europe. His uncle was killed at the battle of Varna in 1444. Four of his younger brothers, in their turn, ascended the Polish throne and he himself administered Poland while the Polish king was away for a short while. His administration was regarded as one of prudence and justice.

For himself he chose the single state and was regarded as a person remarkable for his piety. He fasted often and had a great devotion to Our Lady. We are told that he was "just in all his ways".

He died on 4th March 1484 as a comparative young man, aged 26yrs. His remains are interred in the Chapel of the Blessed Virgin in the Cathedral at Vilnius, in Lithuania. [Deacon Elfed]

People's words flow out of what fills their hearts: this is very much the theme of today's Gospel reading and its background extract from the Hebrew scriptures that we are given in the first [Introduction to the Mass] reading.
