MISSIONARY APPEAL NEXT WEEKEND.

Before Covid we used to extend our parish hospitality to various Missionary priests and nuns who would come among us with their stories of Mission Lands and their experiences of spreading the Gospel in hostile environments. Next weekend (Sept 2nd / 3rd) we welcome Fr. John Convery s.x. who is a Xaverian Missionary. He will preach the annual Mission Appeal on behalf of the St. Francis Xavier Foreign Mission Society. The Xaverian Missionaries first came to the UK in 1948 with the goal of inviting others to join their missionary purpose and commit themselves to the proclamation, of the Good News around the world.

JUSTICE AND PEACE GROUP HANDOUT.

Members of the justice and Peace Group will be distributing their Handout which updates the Parish on the projects with which they have been involved in recent months. This will be available on the weekends of Sept 9th and 16th. You will hear about Cafod's "Fix the Food System Campaign", which is focusing particularly on seeds. Small farmers who produce the majority of the world's food, need to be able to choose which seeds to plant and should also be able to share these seeds. This power is being taken away from them by big institutions and international Corporations. Thousands of people in many parishes across Britain have already told the UK Government to urge to World Bank to protect the rights of farmers. You too will have a chance to sign the letter of support of Salina, a small scale farmer from Bangladesh, who has written to the World Bank herself on this important matter. The signing will take place after Masses on the two weekends mentioned earlier.

SAINT OF THE WEEK. ST. AUGUSTINE OF HIPPO. MONDAY 28TH AUGUST.

Augustine was born in the year 354 in North Africa to a Christian mother and a pagan father. He was enrolled as a catechumen for baptism but drifted from Christianity in the years he spent studying in Carthage. There he received the best education Rome had to offer and became a rhetorician and teacher. He spent a decade in the Manichaean religion, but through the tireless efforts of his mother St. Monica, and with the guidance of St. Ambrose, Bishop of Milan, Augustine returned to the Catholic faith. He parted from his long-term concubine and was baptized at the age of 33yrs in Milan.

After his mother's death, he returned to Africa where he became a monk. He was ordained a priest in 391 and four years later, became Bishop of Hippo. Until his death in 430, Augustine was a busy Pastor in his diocese and a leader in the Church of North Africa. He found time to compose a vast body of theological writings which have made him one of the most influential theologians in the history of the Church. Among his writings are his autobiographical Confessions, a vast treatise on the place of Christianity in world history called The City of God, a masterful study of the Trinity and hundreds of letters and sermons.
