ST. MARY'S WILL REOPEN NEXT SUNDAY.

St. Mary's church in Dinas Powys will re-open for public Mass on **Sunday 4th October at 11.15am.**

This is truly a joyous occasion after six months of lockdown when the church has had to remain closed because of Coronavirus. However, as we are too painfully aware, the pandemic is still out there and is still as much a danger as it ever was. We have to comply with current government regulations of course which impinge on our personal liberties in many ways. Because of social distancing, the number of persons allowed in St. Mary's church for mass is limited to **40 people**. Stewards will be on hand to guide and direct the congregation so that everyone stays safe and well.

NEW SUNDAY MASS TIME IN ST. JOSEPH'S.

Because the 11.15am Mass on Sunday morning will return to St. Mary's on **Sunday 4th October**, the **9.30am** Mass in St. Joseph's will be re-established. Although there may be a sense of "a slow return to normal" in the reinstatement of the Sunday morning Masses with the familiar Mass times, it is, of course, a different experience of Mass to what we have been used to, and nothing is going to be quite the same any time soon. It is worth reminding ourselves that the Sunday Obligation has been lifted for the duration of the pandemic and so, with the second spike of the virus expected, no one should feel that they have to put themselves at risk by leaving their homes if they feel vulnerable. Masses will continue to be streamed from St. Joseph's.

FACE MASKS MUST BE WORN IN CHURCH.

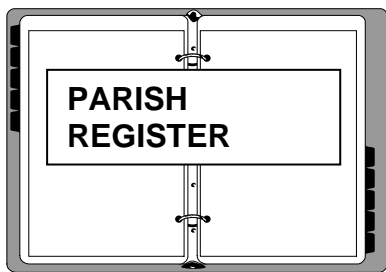
