RE-OPENING OF ST JOSEPH'S – VOLUNTEERS.

Although we have received the green light from the Welsh Government to re-open our churches for private prayer, there are strings attached of course. And although we are making every effort to meet the stringent conditions imposed, in addition to all of them, we will also need to have a small team of **stewards** to supervise the coming and going of people at each opening. They would also be responsible for cleaning down surfaces and touch points at the end of their "watch". PPE and materials will be provided.

Two stewards should be present for each one-hour session. They should be under 70yrs and not have underlying health issues. They should be over 16yrs.

The plan is that we want to open the church for one hour per day, three times a week, if we can get enough people to volunteer. Six people would cover one week, 12 two weeks and so on.

A meeting of stewards will be arranged under Covid restrictions.

This is the first step in preparing for the eventual reopening of our churches for the celebration of Mass and the sacraments. The risk of Coronavirus is going to be with us for some time and so we must learn to live with it for now. Social distancing and restriction in numbers are not going to disappear any time soon. However, we will at least have made a start.

"YOU ARE PETER....."

AND ON THIS ROCK I WILL BUILD MY CHURCH..."

"*Tu es Petrus et super hanc petram aedificabo ecclesiam meam.*" These words are inscribed around St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. And with these words Jesus bestowed on Peter (and his successors) their leadership role, and vested his Church with the authority to speak and act in His name. The Church has never doubted her credentials and this confidence has given the Church certain distinguishing characteristics which we profess every Sunday when we say the Nicene Creed: We say "We believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church".

The Church is ONE, one in faith; one in worship, and united under one head.

The Church is HOLY; it offers the means of holiness to all its members, through the Mass and the sacraments.

The Church is CATHOLIC, it is universal;

And the Church is APOSTOLIC, it has a mission; proclaiming the Gospel and Apostolic Tradition to all generations.

Today's feast reminds us that WE ARE THE CHURCH in our own time, and so we have to have these same characteristics both individually and collectively.

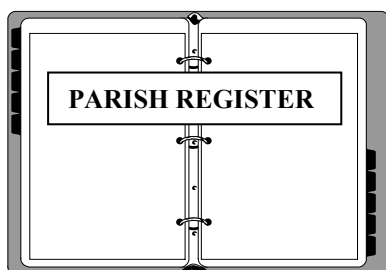
We have to be ONE, united in one faith and loyal to the Pope, the successor of Peter, and loyal to our archbishop, George and the other Bishops, successors to the apostles.

We have to be HOLY, striving to live holy lives based on a personal relationship with the Lord Jesus.

We have to be CATHOLIC; our Catholic identity should reflect who we are and what we stand for.

We have to be APOSTOLIC; the Church's Mission has to be our mission and responsibility.
