CAFOD's "Fix the Food System" Campaign

Our global food system was broken even before the recent disasters of war in Ukraine and the worst drought in East Africa in 40 years. Priority has been given to growing a small number of staple crops for export; agricultural land in low-income countries is used for growing crops profitable on the global market but a high use of fertilisers has degraded the land. Reliance on imported food makes people vulnerable to shocks such as drought, conflict or global price hikes. Climate change is making survival much harder for small communities with whom CAFOD works.

In the words of Pope Francis: "We need a new mind-set and a new holistic approach...and food systems that protect the Earth and keep the dignity of the human person at the centre, that guarantee sufficient food globally and promote decent work locally and that feed the world today without compromising her future." Enough food is produced in the world to feed everyone yet around 800 million go hungry each day. St John Paul II called this "the paradox of abundance". Food injustice is affecting the UK too where every town now has its foodbank. Read more about this at cafod.org.uk/food. They call on the Foreign Secretary to implement the Government's COP 26 commitments and support agricultural systems that tackle climate change and put local communities first. 
