

Cardiff and the Vale Citizens Alliance Special Parish Meeting - Thursday 17th July in St. Joseph's Hall at 7.30pm.

This is a new community based initiative which, when it is launched in October 2014, will mirror other Citizens Alliances which are already up and running in various parts of the UK. Our local Citizens Alliance will be made up of a diverse mixture of communities from religious groups, secular groups, universities, schools, charities and trades unions. Our local organiser is Jonathan Cox, son of Rev Peter Cox, vicar of All Saints Church, Penarth.

Prior to the launch in October, a special parish meeting will take place in St. Joseph's Hall on Thursday 17th July at 7.30pm. The speaker will be Jim Barnaville of St. David's Cathedral, who is well versed in Catholic social teaching.

Cardiff and the Vale Citizens Alliance has the backing and support of Archbishop George Stack and Archbishop Barry Morgan, who will both be prominent at the launch.

Canon Joe is asking for parishioners to come to the meeting and find out more about its aims and objectives, and how they can play a part in preparing for its launch in October.

Please come along and join Canon Joe so that St. Joseph's and St. Mary's can play its part in what is going to be an important instrument for bringing about change, for social iustice and for the common good.

Y Cylch Catholig (Catholic Youth Camp)

The Cylch Catholig has arranged a weekend on 22nd to 24th August at the Urdd Camp, Glan-llyn, Bala,. The camp has been run very successfully for the last 15 years and is for young people between 10 and 18 years of age. Some of the activities will be in common and some separately for the juniors (10-14yrs) and the seniors (15-18yrs). As many young Welsh speaking Catholics go to non-Catholic schools this is a wonderful opportunity for them to receive some Catholic instruction in a relaxed and friendly atmosphere. It is also a chance for them to meet other young Catholics of the same age and have the opportunity to get to know them.
