COVID RESTRICTIONS RELAXED.

With the lifting of the 2-metre social distancing requirement we can return to Mass with a full congregation and switch Holy Communion back to its proper place in the Mass. This takes us back to where we were in Advent, before the current restrictions were re-imposed on Boxing Day. The Barrier Tape has therefore been removed in both churches and all pews are back in use. The lifting of other restrictions can follow in due course when appropriate risk assessments have been carried out.

SAINT OF THE WEEK. St. John Bosco. January 31st.

Whenever we go abroad to a country that we would regard as "poor", we are regularly bothered by children who are consistently trying to sell us things, matches, chewing gum, lighters, sweets or other things. I personally recall in India, even some children trying to sell themselves to us – which shocked me to the core.

Often tourists do give them some money or just wave them away. They are the children of the poor or they are orphaned and they are simply trying to make a living for themselves and even their families. Imagine what it was like in 19th century Turin, one of the most prosperous cities of Europe at the time. Families used to flock to it from lands all around, thinking the place was full of opportunities for them to make a better living.

St. John Bosco took these street children, of which there were many, picked them up off the street and made them his life's work. Juggling away on a huge tightrope so that he could help many of these unfortunate children, as a priest in Turin, he recognised their need and tried to help them through education – also providing accommodation when it was needed. He did not wave them by, but took real and effective action for their benefit. He founded a religious order, the Salesians, which continues that work even today, often under the same difficulties and more. Born in 1815 and died in 1888 on 31st January, he is the Patron Saint of young people, especially those who live in poverty. Rev [Deacon Elfed]
